Character and Appearance:

The application site is a two-storey detached dwellinghouse with wide frontage and in and out private front driveway. It lies on the west side of Chester Road a built-up urban area in Chigwell. Surrounding area of characterised by its larger detached dwellings of varying architectural styles. The site is located on a bend and ground levels differ due to an incline in road to the north.

Consent is sought for the removal of existing low-lying front boundary walls and replacement with 1.7m high brick pillars with 0.65m high front boundary wall, black metal gates with metal fencing atop the lower lying walls.

The relatively closed black metal fencing provides a heavy quality to the front boundary both due to the materials and form. Overall, the proposal is considered at odds with the character and appearance of the setting where front boundaries are largely open or comprise low level walls and/or landscaping.

The planning statement refers to a recent approval at number 37 Chester Road EPF/1881/24. Whilst this consent was for a similar proposal description i.e. sliding metal front boundary gates, they are of a differing scale, size and materials which in comparison do not amount to harm to the overall character of the setting. Metal railings provide intervisibility, which the subject proposal does not instead closing off the full frontage within the streetscene with incongruous sections of full height walls on either end.

The proposal is considered to result in adverse harm to the general visual amenity and character and appearance of the streetscene.
